## **Principal Message**

Dear Parent/Carer,

It has been another amazing couple of weeks here at Highfield Leadership Academy and one that has required a great deal of 'resilience' from all of our students and staff. At the end of this half term, I wanted to write and thank you for your continued support in the safe return of your child to school. Overall school attendance has been exceptionally strong and is now at a higher level to last year.

We are delighted that Highfield Leadership Academy (<a href="#">@HighfieldLA</a>) and more specifically our "Highfield Helpers" project has been shortlisted for the Community and collaboration award category in the 2020 #TesAwards

I have been delighted to see students back in school, enjoying their lessons, socialising with friends and working closely with their teachers again. Students are still enjoying a full curriculum with access to specialist resources and equipment working on the principal of a 'recovery curriculum' so that teachers can assess and act upon any gaps in knowledge.

We had the privilege to welcome our Year 7 pupils who have adjusted really quickly to life at Highfield Leadership Academy with their involvement in our leadership opportunities and supporting our local community.

Supporting students' emotional health and wellbeing has always been at the forefront of our pastoral package; we realise now more than ever that this offer is vital in providing students with the care that they may require. We have put a diverse package of support in place, including additional training for dedicated in-school staff to offer emotional health and well-being support to our students to ensure we have the resources to effectively support and advise students during this difficult time.

During the half term break, I hope students have a well-earned rest and that they return to school fit and healthy after the break. With this in mind please can I urge parents to follow government guidance in minimising the risks to your child by reminding them to socially distance, wear a mask and wash their hands regularly.

As always we have a comprehensive programme of lessons running throughout the break, to support Yr11 students in preparation for their assessments when they return. The programme over the holidays has been shared separately with Yr11 parents. As always, thank you for your continued support.

Another piece of work this half-term that all our students throughout the school have engaged with has been raising awareness of and supporting "Food Poverty". It is estimated that 14% of UK families have experienced food poverty in the last 6 months. Up to 2.3million children could be hungry each day. We collected canned items, dried food and long-life cartons to donate to local food banks and charitable organisations with nearly 1000 items being collected. With over 9000 children in Blackpool living on the poverty line we know that all of these donations will be greatly received.

This half-term also saw the very first "Virtual Open Event", remember applications close for 2021 on 31<sup>st</sup> October, so please remind anyone who has a child in Year 6.



- Aerosols are not permitted on site


#### **REMINDERS FOR PARENTS**
