Dear Parent/Carer,
This week, we see the publication of our very first edition of Highfield Highlights written and designed by our pupils to showcase the events in school from their perspective. Also this week we have had visiting speakers and mentors in school to work with our Year 7 pupils in their development as young adults from Blackpool FC, which has been very engaging and raised lots of questions from our inquisitive learners.

On $14^{\text {th }}$ May, we received a very positive quality assurance visit from Star's Director of Quality Assurance and an External Expert from the Department of Education. They were very happy with our progress since the publication of the Ofsted report and in particular the impact of our new behaviour system in helping pupils to self-regulate around our disruptive and red line behaviours. They felt the school was orderly and calm and commented positively on the improvements in the quality of teaching. Pupils reported that they feel safe in school and know who to turn to if they have a problem. Our anti-bullying ambassadors impressed the QA team with their strategies and initiatives to stamp out all forms of bullying through our Culture of Kindness and Be Your Best campaign. Moving forwards, they would like Teachers to focus more on their use of questioning in the classroom in order to draw out more extended answers from our pupils to deepen their learning.

Formal exams are now well underway and our Year 11 pupils are working really hard, extending their school day by attending breakfast and after school exam booster sessions. This offers a final opportunity for them to ask staff any questions and receive advice and support. I would like to express my thanks to you for your support in our drive for high standards. I hope you have enjoyed this round up of a very, very busy opening Summer term at Highfield.

I am so proud of everything that our pupils achieve and especially of how well they are representing themselves, our school and our community. Leaders and staff are working very hard to transform the culture of the school with the stronger emphasis on rewards for our STAR values of Service, Teamwork, Ambition and Respect. Over the last half term, we have awarded thousands of achievement points and given pupils the opportunities to take part in a number of memorable activities. As part of this, an increased number of reward postcards have also been sent home.

Next half term, we will be rewarding all of our pupils with $100 \%$ attendance and punctuality and zero behaviour points with a Star Citizens Award along with a Sundae Fun Day experience.

Thanks go to our STAR Trust Central Team for their continued support in helping us to move forward rapidly, particularly around behaviour, rewards, teaching, curriculum and outcomes.

As validated by the quality assurance team, the new behaviour system is continuing to have a strong impact and learning time for all pupils has increased along with the quality of learning is lessons. The data collected from learning walks that are carried out every lesson continues to show improvements and a more positive picture each week. The vast majority of pupils are complying with our high standards and are able to self-regulate, which is very positive and all pupils have improved the number of achievement points received this half term. The screening checks in place for struggling pupils have clearly identified personal barriers to behaviour and learning which is resulting in more personalised support to help these pupils succeed both pastorally and academically.

I am very grateful to all of the staff for their dedication and commitment to ensuring that our pupils get the very best experience and support during their time at Highfield Leadership Academy. They are working hard to make sure that our pupils have the best possible chance of success.

Finally and most importantly, I would like to thank you for your ongoing support of your child and our school. We really do appreciate how you are engaging with us to make the school a brilliant environment for our pupils. Next half term, we will hold our first Parent Forum for those who expressed an interest in supporting us on our journey. Through a closer working parental partnership, we look forward to a very bright future for your children.
